them have set out and appointed the following public  
Carriage Roads and diversways private Roads bridle  
roads and foot ways heretofore and over the saids lands and  
Grounds by the said Warrant written out directed to be  
divided allotted and assigned by these presents All  
wards and directions the same several Roads and ways  
heretofore and over the saids lands and Grounds by the said Warrant  
written out directed to be divided allotted and enclosed in  
and since thereafter unshorn and bounded that is to say  
Public Carriage Roads and Highways

The Abingdon Road of the breadth of forty feet leading  
out of the East end of the village of Stanton in its  
present track towards Abingdon

Shipsthorpe Road The Shipsthorpe Road of the breadth of forty  
feet leading out of the north end of the village of  
Stanton in its present track into the Shipton  
Turnpike Road

Appleton Road The Appleton Road of the breadth of thirty  
feet leading out of the Shipton Turnpike Road  
and continuing in a Southward direction in its  
present track into Niggin's Lane toward am neare  
Shipton and Appleton.

Oxford Road The Oxford Road of the breadth of thirty  
feet bearing out of the last described Road at  
the South east corner of Edmund's piece and  
continuing in an Eastward direction towards  
Cotell

Cothill Road The Cothill Road of the breadth of thirty  
feet bearing out of the Warriordown Turnpike

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Road near the Black Horse public house and  
continuing in a Southward direction towards  
Cotell

Wing Hill Way One Public bridle Road and diversways and  
private carriage Road and diversways to westerly  
and out of the breadth of thirty feet leading out  
of the village street of Stanton opposite the  
Red Lion public house in a Southward  
direction in or upon its present track over the  
steps to the South east corner of the garden  
belonging to westerly and called Wing Hill road

Hitchcoppice Way One Public bridle and diversways and  
private carriage Road and diversways of the  
breadth of twenty feet leading bearing out of  
the Coppice Lane near the South corner  
of Niggin's Close and continuing in an  
Eastward direction by the side of old bridle road  
and over an embankment to George Oliver Esquire  
nearly in its present track into the Oxford and  
Sandford public carriage Roads called am neare  
embankment road.

Kingston Inn Way One other Public bridle and diversways  
of the breadth of ten feet bearing out of  
the carriage Turnpike Road near Drakes  
Cott and continuing in a Southward direction  
over an embankment to Thomas Glouc in or  
near its present track into the Hamlet of  
Driford called Kingston Inn way.

Abingdon Foot Way One public Footway of the breadth of  
six feet leading out of the village of Stanton  
at a place called the Step Stones and continuing  
Eastward over the embankment to Glouc's  
Cott and an embankment to the public carriage Road  
leading from Stanton towards Abingdon  
at or near a Cottage belonging to former  
road called the Abingdon Foot way

Garford Foot Way And one other public Foot way of  
the like breadth of six feet bearing out of  
the carriage Turnpike Road near the  
Sands Cott in a South eastward direction  
over an embankment to Thomas Glouc in or  
near its present track into the Hamlet of  
Driford called the Garford Foot way
