There is currently no support programme for children identified as very overweight/obese and evidence shows that very overweight children are likely to maintain overweight/obesity into adult without intervention. Commissioning guidance suggests a support programme should be in place. Currently £55k is not yet contractually committed from obesity and physical activity budgets. Recent National Child Measurement Programme Data (2021) shows an increase in overweight and obesity amongst children in Year R and Year 6. There is currently no support programme for children identified as very overweight/obese and evidence shows that very overweight children are likely to maintain overweight/obesity into adult without intervention. Commissioning guidance suggests a support programme should be in place. The proposed investment is to utilise the funding for a weight management support programme for children and teenagers.</p>

Evidence suggest obesity and sedentary behaviour have increased due to the ongoing impact of Covid-19. A system wide approach to tackling obesity is in its early stages. Review has found a gap in a lack of weight management support service for children.</p>
